SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT, YEAR C

Sometimes we keep on waiting for the best time only to find ourselves with no time anymore in the end. There are cupboards with cans of expired por and beans and spaghetti because we keep on waiting for the right time to open them. At times, we keep on delaying, waiting and so in the end, we lose all chances.

When Jesus was born into the world, notice the conditions given by the gospels. It was the time of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate, King Herod, Annas and Caiaphas. It was a time of corruption and violence, oppression and injustice, domination, and exile. Obviously, it was not the ideal time!

But here comes John the Baptist, the voice crying out in the wilderness, announcing the coming of the Messiah. "Make straight the path, for the Lord has come!" Waiting for the Lord is not doing nothing. Waiting for the right time is creating the right time, even if it just means initiating the fullness of time.

Jesus did not just wait for the ideal time. He created the fullness of time. He chose to become human because he knew humanity's greatest need – salvation. He began to preach and work for justice, peace, truth, love, and mercy. He began to be the Good News and so the Word became flesh.

Hence, the fullness of time is not a point in history that was simply waited upon. It was patiently crafted by God's chosen instruments. It was an evolution of journeys that finally reached a fitting conclusion. The right time was a synergy of God's grace and human's faith. The right time did not just happen. It was carved out in faith by people like Isaiah, David, Mary, Joseph, John the Baptist, etc. The fullness of time came because of God's great love and human's great trust.

So, are you still waiting for the right moment? Like John the Baptist, get going even if it is not the ideal moment. Like Jesus, submit yourself and all your plans to God and experience his power.

Do not get discouraged if all you see around seems to go against your calling and dreams. Do not think you can never find the ideal time. Do not get tired when circumstances seem to point otherwise. This is the right attitude despite the Covid anxiety and chaos.

Always remember Christmas. Remember the right time when the Lord was born!

PARISH POLICY AND PLAN FOR THE TRAFFIC LIGHT SYSTEM

We are in orange color at the start of the traffic light system. Taking into account Cardinal John's objectives and guidelines and the government's COVID-19 Protection Framework – Guidelines for Places of Worship, the Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Liturgy Committee came up with a policy and plan surrounding the celebration of Mass and any parish gatherings.

There are two "kinds" of Mass according to attendance: the My Vaccine Pass Mass (requiring a My Vaccine Pass – meaning the person is fully vaccinated or has received two doses of the vaccine) and the Restricted Number Mass (the person is either unvaccinated or has not received a full dose of the vaccine).

POLICY

Orange

The two Sunday Masses (5.30 vigil Mass and 9.15 am Mass) will be the My Vaccine Pass Masses with no limit. A Restricted Number Mass with a 50-person limit will be on Sunday at 1pm.

<u>Green</u>

The two Sunday Masses (5.30 vigil Mass and 9.15 am Mass) will be the My Vaccine Pass Masses with no limit. A Restricted Number Mass with a 100-person limit will be on Sunday at 1pm.

It is important to note that the cardinal has instructed that all people involved in the mass, including priest, for the My Vaccine Pass Mass have to have full vaccination and thus possess a My Vaccine Pass.

PLAN

A plan for implementation should be prepared for each color scheme.

<u>Orange</u>

St. Joseph's Church will begin in orange color the Sunday after the traffic light system takes effect.

My Vaccine Pass Mass

Since there is no limit for this type of gathering, no booking system needed. The only thing needed to do is the checking (by

sighting) the My Vaccine Pass at the entry of the Church. People need to come early to enable a smooth flow of the process. Signing up or scanning the QR Code is still required.

Restricted Number Mass

In Orange color, 50 people at most can be accommodated in the Sunday Mass which will be at 1 pm. This will be part of the regular schedule all throughout in the traffic light system. Additional Masses will be provided on Saturday evening at 7 pm and Sunday evening at 6 pm should the need arise. Local booking system will be in place to be able to know if there is a need to provide additional Masses. Please look down for the booking system.

Green

St. Joseph's Parish will most likely be in this color if the double dose vaccination rate reaches 90%.

My Vaccine Pass Mass

Since there is no limit for this type of gathering, no booking system needed. The only thing needed to do is the checking (by sighting) the My Vaccine Pass at the entry of the Church. People need to come early to enable a smooth flow of the process. Signing up or scanning the QR Code is still required.

Restricted Number Mass

In Orange color, 100 people at most can be accommodated in the Sunday Mass which

will be at 1 pm. This will be part of the regular schedule all throughout in the traffic light system. Local booking system will be in place to be able to know if there is a need to provide additional Masses. Please look down for the booking system.

STRATEGIC IMPLEMENTATION

Booking system for the My Vaccine Pass Mass will continue as usual for red color scheme. There will be no need for booking once we are in the orange and green as there are no limits to numbers.

Booking System for the Restricted Number Mass is as follows:

- Parishioners and non-parishioners can book in our local restrictive number Mass.
- It is encouraged that the fully vaccinated ones will not book in this system.
 That would maximize the opportunity for unvaccinated ones to be able to come to Mass.
- 3. The booking for Mass can be done in many different ways Please go to the Different Booking System Section.
- 4. All bookings will be received until Friday afternoon at 3 pm.
- 5. (for the red color) If it is found out that there are more than 10 people registered for the 1 pm Mass, the first 10 shall be accommodated to that particular time. The other ones will be scheduled at a different time: either 7 pm Saturday vigil Mass or Sunday 6 pm Mass or both. They will be notified with the change by Friday afternoon.

Different Booking System For Restricted Number Mass

- 1. Go to www.stjosephlevin.com and click the yellow button for the "Restricted Number Mass."
- 2. Scroll down and you should be seeing the upcoming events.
- 3. Click RSVP button. It will take you to the booking form.
- 4. Fill in the needed information and click the "Next" button. You cannot go to the next page if you do not complete the form.
- 5. Tick the box to agree with the policy for the Restrictive Number Mass.
- 6. Then click submit.
- 7. You will receive a confirmation email that you have booked in successfully.

*Do not forget to scroll down every time after you click a button.


