Re: CHANGE IN ALERT LEVELS

Hello,

As you will have heard this afternoon the Greater Wellington Area, including the Wairarapa and the Kapiti Coast has been moved to Alert Level Two. Out of concern for safety, the whole North Island part of the Archdiocese (this includes St. Joseph's Levin) is included in the information below, as the contacts with the infected person have been extensive.

As we are now in Alert Level Two:

There will be no Vigil or Sunday Masses this weekend, and no other liturgical or parish gatherings.

Funerals are restricted to 100 people, and social distancing and contact tracing are essential. Please follow the directions of the Funeral Director.

For the next three days, due to the number of places the infected person visited and the likelihood of multiple contacts there will be no weekday Mass either.

Once again, the change in Alert Levels means that good parish communication is more important than ever. Please make contact with as many parishioners as possible through emails, parish apps, emailed newsletters etc to ensure that parishioners can be reached quickly.

WHAT IS PETER'S PENCE?

Peter's Pence is called the financial aid that the faithful offer to the Holy Father as a sign of adherence to the concern of the Successor of Peter for the multiple needs of the universal Church and for works of charity in favor of the most needy.

The purposes of the Pence

Answer: St Margaret Mary Alacoque, 1647-90. She received visions of Jesus saying, "Behold the Heart that has so loved men." Several religious orders have a particular devotion to the Sacred heart.

The contribution of the offering to the Pope, for the exercise of his universal mission, is manifested in two ways: in financing the many service activities carried out by the Curia (e.g. formation of the clergy, communication, promotion of integral human development, education, justice, etc.) and in contributing to numerous works of material assistance directed to the most needy.

The Pence therefore has a **dual purpose**: 1) the **support of the universal mission of the Successor of St. Peter**, who, for this purpose, makes use of a complex of organisms which take the name of the Roman Curia and over one hundred Pontifical Representations scattered throughout the world, and, 2) **support for the Pope's charitable works** in favor of the most needy.

The use of proceeds

The offerings of the faithful are intended to support the activities of the Holy Father for the whole Universal Church. These activities are those carried out by the Holy See. The Pope, as Pastor of the whole Church, is concerned both with the needs of evangelization (spiritual, educational, justice, communication, political charity, diplomatic activity ...) and with the material needs of poor dioceses, religious institutes and faithful in serious difficulties (poor, children, elderly, marginalized, victims of wars and natural disasters; special aid to Bishops or Dioceses in need, Catholic education, aid to refugees and migrants, etc.)

Every service provided by the Holy See and destined for the entire Universal Church is possible thanks to the Pence. In fact, it guarantees the activity of the Dicasteries that assist the Pope every day in the exercise of his ministry.

WHY DO WE...hold exposition?



What we call 'Exposition' is the ceremony of exhibiting the Blessed Sacrament for adoration by the faithful. It is considered private when the Eucharist remains in the ciborium, brought forward to the Tabernacle door; public, when a large Host in the lunula of a monstrance is positioned for all adorers to see.

This devotion developed and grew during the Middle Ages, when there was a strong desire to view the consecrated

Host. The feast of Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ) also had its influence on this form of Eucharistic piety. Modern liturgical reform tends to understate such static adoration in favour of the more dynamic action of the Mass. Nevertheless, it is considered a valuable practice whereby the faithful may be invited to spiritual communion with Jesus. It is recommended that parish churches should have at least one period of time each year when the Blessed Sacrament is solemnly exposed. Shorter periods of time for Exposition can be arranged, eg before Benediction.
